

### SITUATION


- 50% of the population is under 18 years old
- Government hospitals are poorly equipped & funded
- Children can wait for months with no treatment and are left permanently disabled or face premature death

- One4Another uses private Ugandan clinics & surgeons
- Surgeries are provided quickly & competently

### D4A Mission:

Lifelong disability in Ugandan children can be prevented or significantly alleviated through proper treatment.

Children who live in poverty who also have a disability are considered the 'poorest of the poor'. They have almost no way out of their situation.



### Children with disabilities in Uganda:



#### Are more likely to:

- Be neglected
- Abused / Abandoned
- Malnourished
- Remain poor
- Believe to be cursed
- Called names
- Contract disease
- Live with chronic pain

#### Are less likely to:

- Go to school
- Receive medical care
- Escape crushing poverty
- Receive proper nutrition
- Avoid the deterimental effects of traditional bone setters
- Be let out of the house

Due to poor management children with relatively minor conditions such as fractures and infections come in with significant deformities and life threatening wounds, and can end up with lifelong disabilities. Our work aims at addressing mismanaged conditions and seeks to provide quality surgical care.

FRACTURES = \$850




